

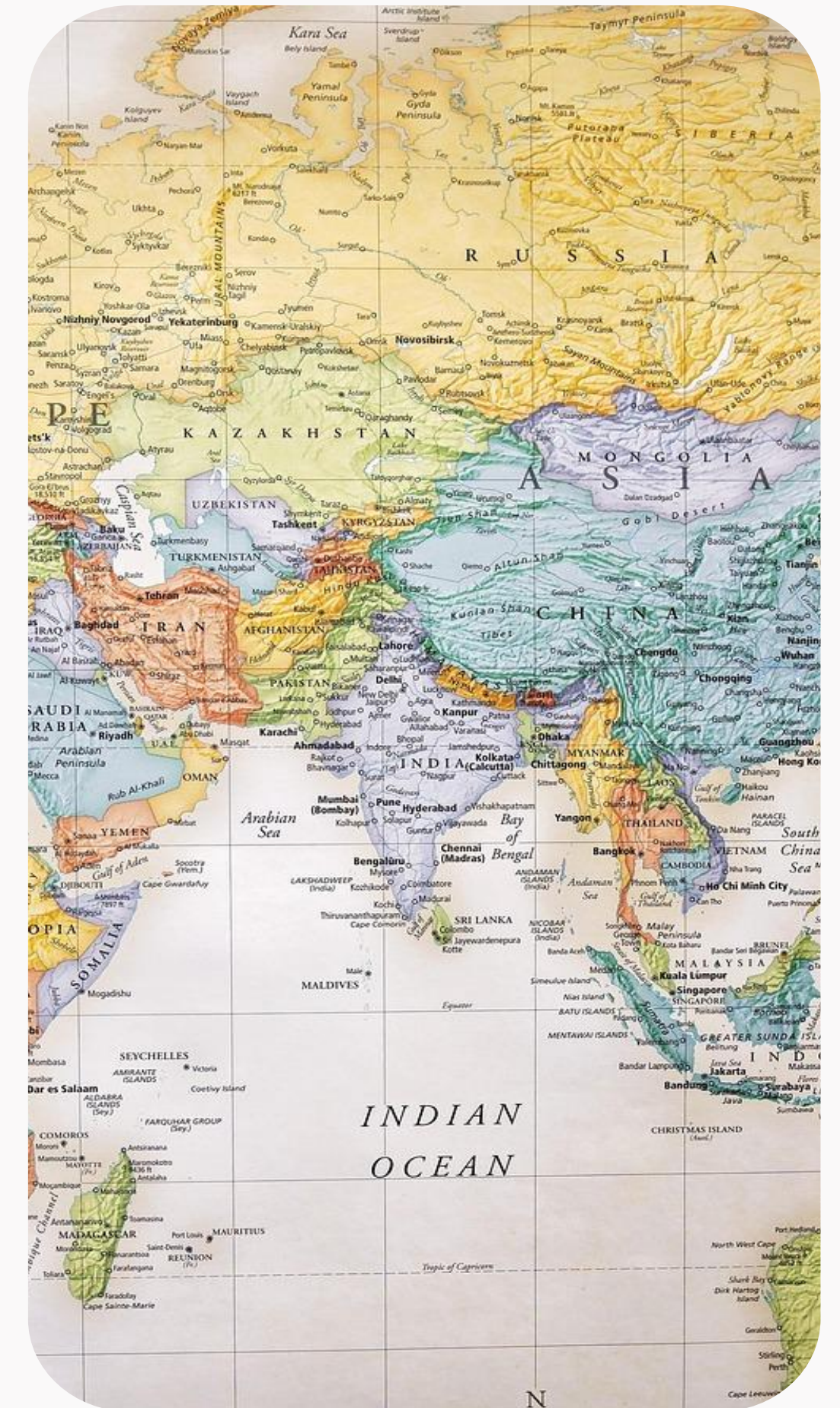

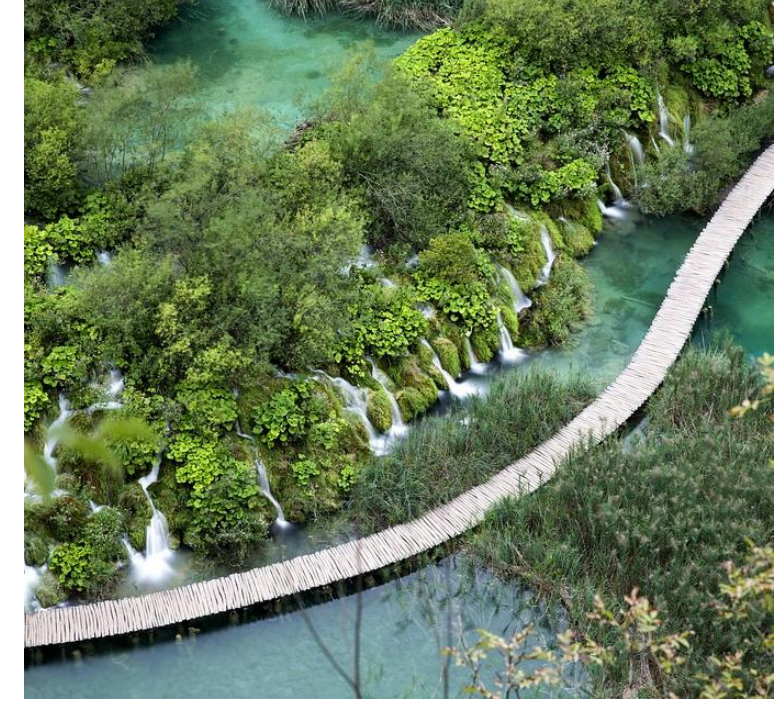

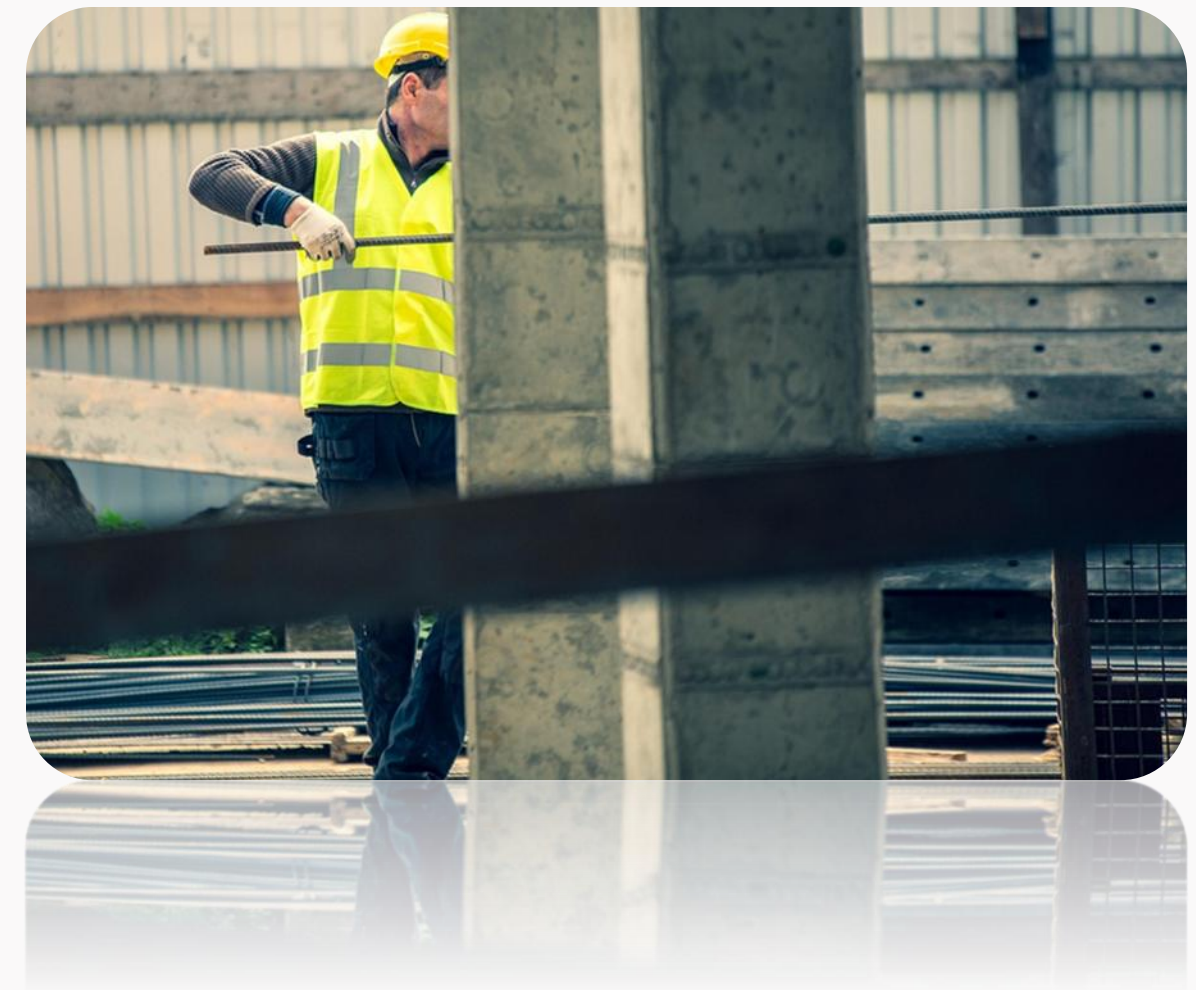
INDEPENDENT COUNTRY FROM – 1991

FOREIGN WORKERS IN CROATIA

- average age - 37 years
- around 30 % of foreign workers are female
- increase in male-female ratio
- countries – Bosnia and Herzegovina, Nepal, Serbia, India, Phillipines
- 20% have tertiary education
- 40% construction industry, 27 % hospitality, 14% manufacturing



Female workers in Croatia



- Employed persons in Croatia – 1,75 million (female - 46,4%)

Female workers in Croatia:

- on average less payed than men
- more likely to experience mobbing
- more involved in taking care of the household and children

Challenges for foreign female workers:

- language barrier, cultural differences, housing issues, less social support, being away from family and friends, less likely to know national law and regulations in the field of occupational health and safety...
